Fyrn's Convention Chicken Noodle Soup

Merry Christmas, WVBA members. I hope you are weaving a Merry Christmas and look forward to a great 2015.

Many of our members at the convention liked my chicken noodle soup, so I thought I would give you the recipe and you can add it to the convention cookbook.

Enjoy, Fyrn Frame

CHICKEN SOUP FOR 32 WVBA 2014 CONVENTION

2 whole chickens or parts to equal
Diced carrots
Diced celery
Diced onion
4 ounces butter
2 teaspoons parsley
3 ounces chopped pimento
Celery salt
Salt and Pepper to taste
8 ounces *Ashery's Chicken Flavored base w/parsley

Cook chickens, carrots, celery and onion in very large pot of water until done.

Cool and remove bones and skin from chicken.

Save everything, broth, chicken, and veggies until ready to use.

When ready to use bring broth to boil and add enough water to equal 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ gallons of liquid. Add butter, parsley flakes, pimento, celery salt and salt and pepper to taste.

I then add chicken back in and 8 ounces * Ashery's Chicken Flavored base w/parsley.

Let simmer until about 15 minutes before you are going to serve it.

I then add 2 pounds of noodles, cover and remove from heat. The noodles will cook but will not be mushy.

Enjoy.




